



A lost sheep – "there will be more joy in heaven ..."


A lost coin – "there is joy in the presence of the angels of God"

"Now in all Israel there was no one who was praised as much as Absalom for his good looks. From the sole of his foot to the crown of his head there was no blemish in him." (2 Samuel 14, 25)

"You were the seal of perfection, full of wisdom and perfect in beauty. Your heart was lifted up because of your beauty ..." (Ezekiel 28, 12.17)

"After this it happened that Absalom provided himself with chariots and horses and fifty men to run before him."

(2 Samuel 15, 1)

Now Adonijah the son of Haggith exalted himself, saying, I will be king and he prepared for himself chariots and horsemen, and fifty men to run before him. (1 Kings 1, 5)

"Now Absalom would rise early and stand beside the way to the gate. So it was, whenever anyone who had a lawsuit came to the king for a decision, that Absalom would call to him and say, "What city are you from?" And he would say, "Your servant is from such and such a tribe of Israel." Then Absalom would say to him, "Look, your case is good and right; but there is no deputy of the king to hear you."

Moreover Absalom would say, "Oh, that I were made judge in the land, and everyone who has any suit or cause would come to me; then I would give him justice." And so it was, whenever anyone came near to bow down to him, that he would put out his hand and take him and kiss him. In this manner Absalom acted toward all Israel who came to the king for judgment. So

Absalom stole the hearts of the men of Israel." (2 Samuel 15, 2-6)

"For you have said in your heart: 'I will exalt my throne above the stars of God; I will also sit on the mount of the congregation on the farthest sides of the north; I will be like the Most High."

(Isiah 14, 13-14)

In this manner Absalom acted toward all Israel who came to the king for judgment. So Absalom stole the hearts of the men of Israel. (2 Samuel 15, 6)

You were perfect in your ways from the day you were created, till iniquity was found in you. (Ezekiel 28, 15)

And with Absalom went two hundred men invited from Jerusalem, and they went along innocently and did not know anything. (2 Samuel 15, 11)

His tail drew a third of the stars of heaven and threw them to the earth. (Rev. 12, 4)

"And the king said to the Cushite, 'Is the young man Absalom safe?' And the Cushite answered, 'May the enemies of my lord the king, and all who rise against you to do you harm, be as that young man is!""

(2 Sam. 18, 32)

"Then the king was deeply moved, and went up to the chamber over the gate, and wept. And as he went, he said thus: 'O my son Absalom — if only I had died in your place! O Absalom my son, my son!"

(2 Sam. 18, 33)

"You have heard that it was said, *You shall love your* neighbor and hate your enemy.'
